The Mozaic Project

It all began with the discovery of the fivefold miracle: the hay meadows of Borşa and Dăbâca communes (Cluj County) are the only known site in Europe harbouring all 5 butterfly species belonging to the rare group of the Large Blues (Maculinea spp.). These butterflies have a remarkable ménage à trois life cycle involving a butterfly, an ant and a plant species.

But there is more: the extensively-farmed hay meadows are a valuable but threatened element of the cultural landscape of the new "Eastern Hills of Cluj" protected site within the Natura 2000 network and an important hotspot of plant diversity worldwide.

The Mozaic Project is studying the semi-natural grasslands, land use and socio-economic background of this landscape, in order to develop sustainable strategies to protect these important hay meadows and their exquisite inhabitants and to support lowintensity farming practices.



Activities in the Mozaic Project

- Ecological studies of the vegetation and the rare Maculinea butterflies:
- socio-economic studies to understand the challenges facing farming households and find sustainable development possibilities;
- organising a pilot programme for hay meadows rewarding the farmers for mowing as a basis for suggestions of amendments of the national agrienvironment programme;
- introduction of small hand mowing machines in order to keep the meadows actively used in a sustainable way;
- initiation of discussions and collaborations between the local farmers:
- participation and organisation of seminars with locals, specialists, students and politicians with the aim of education, knowledge exchange and dissemination of our results at the local and national level:
- publishing information sheets about the exceptional ecology of the region as well as traditional knowledge;
- environmental education because sustainability begins with awareness.
